A NOTE FROM OUR PRESIDENT, DAVE HAMMOND

Dear Volunteers.

Like you, the Board of Directors is frustrated by the ongoing obstacles preventing us from building homes. After dedicating the first few years of Sarah's tenure to stabilizing our finances, we were eager to develop the properties we own. Despite our efforts, regulatory roadblocks continue to delay progress. Here's where things stand:



- 300 Wildwood: The DEP has stalled on our environmental update request submitted in September 2024. Despite multiple follow-ups, no progress has been made since November.
- **Sumner Project:** We own five lots in Whitesboro and initially planned five duplexes, assuming Middle Township's affordable housing obligations would work in our favor. However, neighborhood opposition led us to consider an alternate plan of three houses and one duplex which would be permitted "by right". Given our \$100K+ investment up to this point, we've decided to resubmit the original duplex plan and, if rejected, pursue the alternate plan.
- Willow Ave, West Cape May: The property transfer is underway and we just await official documentation. Land clearing will be managed by the borough, but in the meantime, we are in discussion to secure a modular and conducting further site assessment to determine feasibility for a second modular or a stick-built.

We appreciate your patience and commitment. We'll keep you updated as developments unfold.

Over his distinguished career, Mr. Kelley practiced in various areas of law, ultimately co-founding Kelley, Wardell & Crag, L.L.P. and earning recognition as a Certified Civil Trial Attorney. He also served as a Municipal Prosecutor for Merchantville for 30 years and as a board member for Lakeview Memorial Park Association. Appointed to the NJ Superior Court in 2008, he presided over Family, Civil, and Criminal cases in Camden County until his retirement in 2018. Shortly after, he and his wife, Anne Marie, moved to their home in Avalon, NJ, where he initially volunteered with Habitat for Humanity before formally joining the Board. Cape May Habitat Urges State Leaders to Protect Affordable Housing Funding

Executive Director, Sarah Matthews, recently testified along with other NJ Habitat leaders at a state legislative hearing to advocate for preserving the New Jersey Affordable Housing Trust Fund (AHTF) as a dedicated resource for affordable housing development.

Cape May County faces unique challenges—a high home vacancy rate due to seasonal second homes, limited land for development, and a rapidly aging population driving young workers and families out of the area. These issues make the availability of truly affordable housing more critical than ever.

The AHTF is often the only public funding for small. 100% affordable available homeownership developments—the kind Habitat builds for low- and moderate-income families," Matthews stated. Habitat Cape May has already invested \$100,000 in its largest project to date, which will provide homes for 10 families, contingent on anticipated AHTF support. Matthews urged lawmakers to prevent any diversion of trust fund dollars, especially in light of proposed state budget changes. She emphasized that the AHTF plays a vital role in enabling organizations like Habitat to collaborate with municipalities and the state to create long-term housing solutions that are sustainable, inclusive, and responsive to local needs.

Cape May Habitat stands committed to advocating for the homes and communities our families deserve. Thank you for supporting our mission.
